1. Confirmation of Approval of Previous Minutes

2. Principal's Report - Mr. Hogan

3. Vice Principal's Report - Kimberley Blanchet

- > Parent teacher interviews
 - Parent interview booking will be online again, opens February 4th, and closes at 11:59pm the day the report cards come home. (We have changed the close time to Wednesday February 13 at 12:00 p.m.
 - It is advised to not book back to back slots as it leaves little time to get from one class to another class.
 - The Parent Interview Nights are scheduled for Wednesday Feb 13th and Thursday February 14th, from 5:30pm to 8pm
- > Student safety reminders
 - All visitors must report to the School Administration Office first.
 - A few additional signs will also be posted.
 - Volunteers are asked to wear a volunteer badge at all times
 - Daycare parents are to use the daycare entrance
 - A new bulletin board will be installed in the front foyer to house catholic value systems, classrooms to add notices etc. (Target February)
 - We have implemented a new washroom pass system during the recess break - this new system will help limit the kids coming in during recess
 - Regular parking and drop-offs remain in the front, please drop off safely and a reminder to keep the bus zones clear at all times as they are on a schedule. The bus drivers will not let children off the bus if they are not in the bus zone.

 - The delivery of International Language within the school day (44 schools) will remain *status quo* for the 2018-2019 school year.
 - Board-wide return was 53%
 - 21 Schools met the 67% threshold (Note: The Board approved in the August 2018 Board report that, "Surveys from 67% of all families in schools must be returned in order for the results to be considered viable".
 - Those schools that did not meet the 67% threshold would not experience any changes to the new ILE format for the 2018-2019 school year.

8. Additional Agenda items / Other Business

- Bullying Prevention Program
 - Parents are questioning what the school is doing
 - Response from Kimberley Blanchet, Vice Principal:
 - We are working through the "Virtues of the Month" and looking to student leadership, as well as all teachers to reinforcing using the same language throughout the school.
 - Understanding the "Code of Conduct", the expectations of the school using this language, and using it consistently.
 - We have classified certain feelings and behaviors into zones (colours / numbers) and aligned each zone with strategies to handle those feelings / behaviours. For example, blue means tired, bored, not engaged, which is considered below where you need to be. Green is happy, good, learning. Yellow is excited, agitated, worried, impulsive or reactive. Red is out of control. Scale 1 to 10 - Blue is 1-3; Green is 4-6; Yellow is 6-8; Red is 9-10.
 - We are enabling them to self identify, and learn mindfulness activities, and incorporate breathing exercises
- > Are there extra curricular sports for younger kids being offered this year?
 - Primary soccer was offered for grade 2 and 3.
 - Kim Blanchet to look into what other extra curricular activities are being offered as well for the younger grades.
- > What kinds of clubs are being offered at lunch?
 - scrabble, board game, knitting club, role playing game, ---- available to a specific age range, drop in.
- Has the school considered doing a ski trip yes, we've done these in the past.
- Parents are inquiring about playground improvements
 - There are grants we can apply for
 - This is done via a separate committee.
