- **Examples:** Listening to educators and partners, collaborating with other parents, considering different approaches to education.
- •<u>Benefits:</u> We all have different ideas and perspectives, but when you are open to listen to others and learn from one another we all benefit for the common thing that we are here for: our children

 Catholic Education makes a difference because our Catholic Faith makes a difference.

 Be the Spiritual Superhero and source of Hope for your children and those around you. Lead by Faith, not by sight.

• <u>Benefits:</u> Your child will benefit from you taking that first step to handling any situations, or just getting involved in school initiatives.


Parent/guardians retain the right to be exempted from curriculum expectations that relate to Human Development and Sexual Health.
